Ordinance Relative To All Night Parking

An ordinance relating to the regulation of traffic and the use of Public Streets and Highways of the Town of Chester to insure adequate snow removal operations.

Be it ordained, by the Selectmen of the Town of Chester, as follows:

Article 1

It shall be unlawful to park or permit to be parked a vehicle on any street in the Town of Chester (to include the parking area around all Town buildings) between November 15 and April 1.

Article 2

Vehicles found in violation of this ordinance will be towed away at the owner's expense.
